



Leadership in Primary Care Collaborative Mentoring Network

As our healthcare system evolves, the **OCFP's Leadership in Primary Care Mentoring Network** has been designed with you, the practising family physician, in mind. The Network supports family physicians to lead change within their practice settings. As a Mentee, you get access to a family physician Mentor and undertake specific activities using tangible tools as you build your competency and confidence to lead and work toward your leadership goals.

The Mentoring Path

Mentoring in the Leadership in Primary Care Network is a structured six-month offering. As a Mentee, you get four to six (4 to 6) hours of individual mentoring sessions. Depending on your preferences and needs, you and your Mentor determine the schedule and methods of interaction – through Skype, telephone, email or texts, for example. You can also engage with other clinicians through an online community of practice. Mentees can continue learning and networking through the community of practice following the formal period of mentorship.

Eligibility to Join

The Network is available to all family physicians in Ontario. If you have a passion for leading change and can commit to four to six hours with a Mentor over a six-month period, we encourage you to complete the **Leadership in Primary Care Mentoring Network Intake Survey** to help us learn a little about you and your areas of interest within leadership. Once accepted to the Network, most Mentees are connected to their Mentors within one week.



There is no cost to join the Leadership in Primary Care Collaborative Mentoring Network. The Network is a 3-credit-per-hour Group Learning program and has been certified by the College of Family Physicians of Canada for up to 15 Mainpro+ credits.
